

The Government of Canada and Pest Management Regulatory Agency recently announced that Strychnine will be de-registered. This will mean 2% liquid concentrate Strychnine can't be manufactured after March 4, 2021, cannot be sold after producers can't use the product after March 4,2023.

Under the Zoning Bylaw, the RM of Meeting Lake No. 466 requires permits to be completed for <u>any</u> new development, construction or demolition on existing properties. Forms available on-line or at the RM office.

A building permit is separate from the development permit. A building permit refers to the building construction and compliance with the National Building Code and is governed by the RM Building Bylaw. Permit application forms are available on-line or at the RM office.

Permits will not be issued until all applicable fees are paid.
