Taxes are due December 31st of each year for that year. If not paid by December 31st, outstanding taxes will become arrears as of January 1st and a penalty of 1% will be applied at the beginning of each month that the taxes remain outstanding. It is your responsibility to review your tax notice(s) and receipt(s) to make sure all the taxes you want paid prior to December 31 of each year are paid.

EXEMPTIONS:

293 exemptions: Pursuant to section 293: of The Municipalities Act, agriculture residences may be exempt from taxation, fully or partially for the value of their Ag land. Please fill out the application form on our website and return to the RM office prior to March 31st, 2024.

As of August 1st, 2022, Interest of 1% is charged to all account receivables outstanding over 30 days.

DUST CONTROL

For 2023: Ratepayers may put environmentally friendly dust control down in front of their residence at their own cost. Ratepayers are required to sign a dust control policy prior to putting dust control down. Forms are available on our website or at the RM Office.

Always report your planned control burn to avoid possible fire call costs. When burning grass, bush piles, stubble, etc. please be sure you are wellprepared and that you have fire guards in place. Prior to any burning, call into the Control Burn Centre at 1-866-404-4911.

Fire Insurance Coverage – Ratepayers are responsible for any firefighting charges when the fire department is called for a fire on your property. Please ensure to have adequate fire insurance coverage.

SNOW REMOVAL ON SEASONAL ROADS/NON-MAINTAINED

The R.M. of Meeting Lake No. 466 will not be responsible for removal of snow on any seasonal roads/non-maintained roads with the exception to a ratepayers' residence where it is being heated during the winter months. The ratepayer who requests the seasonal roads/non-maintained roads it be opened, will be invoiced accordingly. Any other requests will be at discretion of council.

Seeding of Crops on Municipal Road Allowances is Forbidden. Council is requesting that ratepayers do not farm/crop main grid municipal road allowance. Crops will be cut with mower if it is within the one pass of 15 feet, shoulder cut.
