

SASKATCHEWAN WATERSHEDS ENVIRONMENTAL AGRICULTURE PROGRAM (SWEAP): PROGRAM SUMMARY

The SWEAP program, funded through Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada's On-Farm Climate Action Fund, supports the adoption and on-farm implementation of Beneficial Management Practices that focus on increasing carbon sequestration and reducing greenhouse gas emissions. The Saskatchewan Watersheds Environmental Agriculture Program (SWEAP) works with producers to implement Beneficial Management Practices (BMPs) on farms related to Cover Cropping, Nitrogen Management or Rotational Grazing.

| Agronomic Services | 50% of the costs, to a maximum of \$10k |
| Equipment Upgrades to allow for mid-row or side banding, side dressing or injection | up to \$200/foot of seeding equipment to a maximum of \$30k |
| Incorporating Annual Legumes into the Crop Rotation | up to \$35/acre |
| Incorporating Perennial Legumes into the Crop Rotation | up to \$50/acre |
| Nitrification & Urease Inhibitors | 85% of the cost of the inhibitors |
| Polymer Coated Urea (PCU) | 85% of cost difference between PCU & regular nitrogen fertilizer |
| Soil Mapping | 50% of the costs, to a |
| Soil Testing | maximum of \$10k |
| Split Fertilizer Application | 85% of the labor/equipment cost for the in-crop fertilizer application |
| ROTATIONAL GRAZING | |
| Fencing | up to \$10/impacted acre to \$30k combined with watering systems |
| Improving Pasture Composition | up to \$50/acre |
| Remote Watering Systems | up to \$7.5k per system (max 4 systems), to \$30k combined with fencing |

Program Guidelines:

- All projects need to be either a new practice for the operation OR an expanded acres where the practice was not done prior to 2022
- All projects must be endorsed by a licensed agrology professional
- Invoices must dated on or after February 1, 2025
- Total payments cannot exceed \$100,000 from all OFCAF funding sources for the period February 7, 2022 and March 31, 2028.
- Applicants work directly with SAW's Agri-Environmental Coordinators to apply to SWEAP
- Project verification may include invoices, proof of payment, GPS stamped photos and/or other BMP dependent documents
